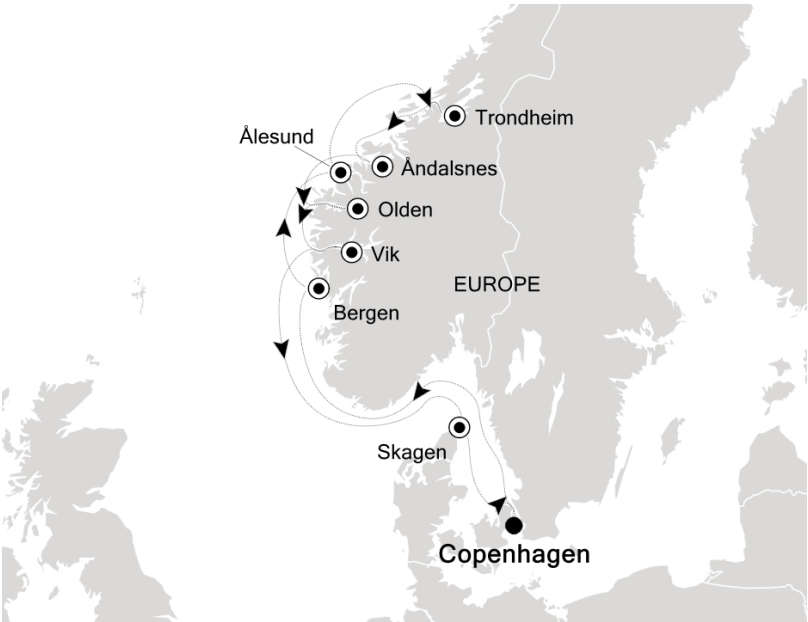

ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore Excursions are available on a first-come, first served basis. Guests should note that some shore excursions are very popular with guests and often ending up being waitlisted. In order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com until 48 hours prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate in excursions are subject to availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge Desk within the cancellation deadline. For our selected Shore Excursions Tickets returned after the cancellation deadline will be charged 100% cancellation fee to the guest's onboard account. Cancellation deadlines for the majority of our shore excursions is 48hrs prior to the port of call. Please note that certain shore excursions might have a different cancellation deadline; all cancellation deadlines are stated in the please note section of the shore excursion, booking form and shore excursion tickets.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

You may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a shore excursion booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the shore excursions in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Shore Excursion tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

Prices are generally quoted per person, per tour, with the exception of Silver Shore Privato or group-designated excursions. Prices are subject to change without notice. As a courtesy to fellow guests, shore excursion departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least 10-minutes prior to the shore excursion departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pierside to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore. SHORE EXCURSION SUITABILITY

Silversea offers a broad range of activities for our guests of all physical capabilities. However, certain excursions are more appropriate for physically fit and active guests. All excursions offered are clearly identified with an activity level to assist you. We also offer a good variety of Accessible Shore Excursion worldwide (according to the ports availability and local structure) that are designed for guests unable to negotiate motor coach steps or for full time wheelchair/scooter users. The vehicle used on this type of shore excursion is adapted with an access ramp (or lift where available) to accommodate a limited number of mobility devices. In order to use the ramp and/or lift, guests are required to be seated on a wheelchair or scooter. For your safety and enjoyment and that of your fellow guests, please be certain to select excursions that meet your physical capability. We therefore encourage guests to review the excursion description carefully including the PLEASE NOTE section which includes useful information. Silversea also offers Destination Experience Briefings onboard. The information is presented in the theatre or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system, and will allow more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicles. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. Children up to the age of 8 years old are only permitted to participate in suitable Silver Shore Excursions and the shuttle service if the vehicles are equipped with the correct safety harness and seating equipment. Such harnesses' and secure seating cannot be guaranteed. Alternately, guests may use their own approved safety seat, booster seat or harness as long as they are compatible with the local touring vehicle and can properly secure the young guest. Silversea reserves the right to refuse children under the age of 8 years old on any tour on the basis of safety.

VIDEO/PHOTOGRAPHY CHARGES

Please note that photography at some museums, sites and monuments and/or the use of video cameras may not be allowed or may incur a charge. HIGHLIGHTS EXPERIENCES

BGO-004 / Trek On Top of Bergen

Difficulty



Price: \$199 - Duration: 3.50 hr(s) Start 8:30 AM

Experience Bergen from above as you hike along Mount Fløyen with trails leading you through the woods, past lakes and to panoramic views of the city.

Mount Fløyen Funicular

Begin your trek with a walk past Haakon's Hall, St. Mary's Church and Bryggen, on the way to Mount Fløyen funicular. You will take the funicular to the mountain top, 320 meters above sea level, where you will have a spectacular view of Bergen.

Mount Fløyen Hiking Trail with Norwegian Treats

Explore the off beaten track taking you through forested areas, past lakes and to some higher mountain areas with views of the city, ocean surrounding it, and the many islands nestled below. Your local guides will share stories with you about the Norwegian culture and their love for nature, as well as the history of the area and life in Bergen. Enroute, you will be treated to some typical Norwegian tastes.

Please note: It is recommended to wear layered clothing and comfortable hiking boots/shoes. The trek covers approximately 5 km on dirt/gravel path, uneven terrain with gradual slopes and can be slippery. This tour involves an extensive amount of physical activity. The route will be tailored to the group. Visibility of sights may be affected in adverse weather conditions. Comfort stop available at the top of the mountain near the funicular.

BGO-010 / Threads Of Tradition: A Knitting Heritage Tour

Difficulty



Price: \$159 - Duration: 3.00 hr(s) Start 1:00 PM

If you've ever wondered what knitting machines look and sound like, or how they manage to create socks and scarves on an industrial scale. this unique excursion will answer those questions and more. Just settle in for a scenic half-hour coach drive north from Bergen as we head for the quaint fjordside village of Salhus, and the historic Salhus Tricotagefabrik knitting factory museum.

This sprawling white complex, the dominant feature of the small town's skyline, hummed with activity from 1859 to 1989 and now serves as a working demonstration showplace celebrating Norway's rich textile production heritage. The factory's period atmosphere endures; you can even catch hints of the distinct smells left behind from decades of production.

A captivating short film lays out the history of Norwegian knitting and sets the stage for your guided walk through the factory floor as you learn about the various production stages, from carding and spinning to winding, knitting, and sewing. And watch the machines in action as they make some of the beautifully crafted knitwear you'll see for sale later in the museum shop.

Your visit also includes a relaxing coffee break to enjoy complimentary Norwegian pastries and coffee or tea in the cozy museum café before returning to Bergen \ perhaps with a lovely piece of Norway to bring home with you.

Please note: This moderate excursion includes approximately 1,600 ft / 500 m of walking, periods of standing, and the navigation of one flight of stairs. A small elevator is available for those with mobility challenges. The guided portion of the visit covers two of the factory museum's four floors; the remaining two floors can be explored optionally during free time at

the venue. Guests must be able to board the coach on their own, and wheelchair-friendly buses may be arranged by advance request. Wear casual clothing and comfortable walking shoes. The order of activities may vary.

BGO-011 / Bergen by E-Bike

Difficulty



Price: \$119 - Duration: 3.25 hr(s) Start 9:15 AM and 12:45 PM

One of the most immersive ways to get to know a European city is to explore it by bicycle \ and if you're on a drive-assisted cycle, all the better. This guided e-bike excursion takes to the streets, byways, and hills of Bergen to provide an invigorating introduction to many of its must-see sights and vantage points.

Your e-bike outfitter is just 5 minutes from the pier. In no time, you'll be fitted, geared up, and ready to head out with your guide to explore the 'city of seven hills.' While the exact duration of the ride can vary based on the collective physical capabilities of the group, it typically covers about 6.25 miles (10 km) in roughly 2.5 hours \ with stops taken for photos and awe at key locations en route.

You'll visit the monument to Madam Felle (a heroine of beer lovers everywhere) in Sandviken, catch epic fjord and city overviews along Fjellveien, and pause at the landmark Skansen Firestation (1860) for an unmissable photo op. Coasting by St. Mary's Church takes you back a lot further in history, to around the year 1150, while a spin around the imposing Bergenhus Fortress gives a sense of the political and military power Bergen commanded in the centuries when it was Norway's capital and largest city.

Your cycling survey concludes back at the pier, where you return the gear and get ready to share stories over dinner of the discoveries you encountered while two-wheeling in Bergen.

Please note: This adventurous guided excursion involves about 2.5 to 3 hours of cycling on e-bikes through hilly areas. Total distance covered is approximately 6.25 mi / 10 km. Participants must be in good physical condition and able to comfortably ride a bike. Bring a water bottle and your preferred sun protection; wear comfortable weather-appropriate clothing and flat closed-toe shoes. The duration of the tour may vary based on the group's capabilities, and the list and sequence of sights seen may vary.

BGO-012 / Bergen during WWII

BGO-A / Scenic Bergen (INCLUDED)

Difficulty



Duration: 2.00 hr(s) Start 10:00 AM and 2:00 PM



On this introduction to Bergen you will see all the highlights of this lovely city, known as the Gateway to the Fjords. This UNESCO World Heritage city has the ideal combination of nature, culture and exciting urban life.

Bergen Scenic Drive

Your scenic drive will take you to the southern residential areas, passing the Royal Residence, Gamlehaugen; Grieghallen, the modern concert hall named after Norway's great composer Edvard Grieg; and the Bergen Theater.

Hanseatic Bryggen

Continuing on, drive past the fish market and the narrow streets of Hanseatic Bryggen with houses dating back to 18th century. The original buildings were destroyed in a fire in the beginning of the 18th century and were rebuilt in the same style as the former buildings from 1350. Your guide will take you on a journey back in time, where you will learn more about the fascinating development of this old Hanseatic city. Admire St. Mary's Church dating back to 1170 and one of the finest examples of Romanesque architecture in Norway. Pass by Koengen, which was once an army depot, and see the medieval Bergenhus Fortress.

Your tour concludes back at the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking. It is suitable for guests who utilise a wheelchair and guests with limited mobility, who are able to embark and disembark the coach via the coach steps.

BGO-O / Best of Bergen (INCLUDED)

Difficulty



Duration: 3.50 hr(s) Start 9:30 AM and 1:45 pm

Discover the most renowned, beautiful, and historic landmarks in Bergen and its surrounds during this immersive, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Bergen Residential Areas, Gamlehaugen Royal Residence, Fana, Fantoft, Stave Church

Leaving the downtown area, drive through the residential areas south of Bergen, towards Fana and the Stave Church. Originally built in Fortun, Sogn in 1150, the old Stave Church was subsequently moved to Fantoft in 1883 to save it from demolition and preserve it as part of the nation's heritage. After a destructive 1992 fire, artisans extensively and faithfully restored the church to its former beauty. Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour inside the Stave Church, and admire its traditional timber construction and elaborately-carved decoration.

Troldhaugen, Composer's Hut, Memorial, Museum, Garden, Free Time

Next, re-board your coach and leap from spiritual faith to musical brilliance during a visit to Troldhaugen, home of legendary Norwegian composer Edvard Grieg. Troldhaugen was built in 1885, and Edvard Grieg lived here for 22 years together with his wife, Nina. Grieg composed many of his best-known works in the Composer's Hut by the shore of Lake Nordås. Upon arrival, you will have time to explore the composer's hut, memorial and gardens. You may choose to visit the villa during your free time. Please be aware that there may be lines to enter the residence.

Hanseatic Bryggen Scenic Drive

Once back in Bergen, drive through the very heart of the city, see the fish market and Hanseatic Bryggen with houses dating back to 18th century. The original buildings were destroyed in a fire in the beginning of the 18th century and were rebuilt in the same style as the former buildings from 1350. Your guide will take you on a journey back in time, where you will learn more about the fascinating development of this old Hanseatic city. Admire St. Mary's Church dating back to 1170 and one of the finest examples of Romanesque architecture in Norway. Pass by Koengen, which was once an army depot, and see the medieval Bergenhus Fortress.

Your tour concludes back on the ship.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 2 kilometres at times over uneven and natural surfaces and inclines, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and wheelchair users. Guests are advised to wear warm, comfortable clothing in layers with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection, a weatherproof jacket, umbrella, bottled water, and credit cards and/or local currency for purchases. The tour sequence may vary. An interior visit of Grieg's villa may not be possible, however guests can always enjoy the park and admire the exterior of the villa. Hanseatic Bryggen

Fish Market

On your return walk stop and admire St. Mary's Church dating back to 1170 and one of the finest examples of Romanesque architecture in Norway. Pass by Koengen, which was once an army depot, and see the medieval Bergenhus Fortress.

The tour concludes back at the pier.

Naustkultur

In 2017 three seafood enthusiasts from Bergen with unique expertise and knowledge in the marine field bought a 30.000 square meter idyllic islet in the outskirts of the city, only reachable by boat. You will try a few of these delicatessens prepared on the bonfire and you are welcome to assist the chef in the preparation and cooking process. Your chef will teach you to open shells, give useful cooking tips and share recipes that you can try at home. There will also be plenty of time to relax and enjoy the serene beauty surrounding the island.

Ålesund

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 40-minute drive through Ålesund, a city built in the Art Nouveau, or 'Jugend' style following a catastrophic fire in 1904. One of few Art Nouveau towns in the world, Ålesund is home to an atmosphere and distinct character embraced by inhabitants and visitors alike. Whilst driving from the harbour through the Art Nouveau centre of the town, marvel at the amazing decorations and colourful facades.

Borgund Stone Church and Sunnmøre Open Air Folk Museum

Next, continue on to Borgund, which was the largest trading centre in Sunnmøre during the Viking Era, then proceed to the Sunnmøre Open Air Folk Museum. Upon arrival, visit some of the old houses and the museum's boat collection.

City Centre

After the visit to the museum, head to the city center, or Skateflua, where your guide will point out the Art Nouveau buildings as well as share stories of this vibrant coastal Norwegian city. Walk along the pedestrian Kongensgata street before returning to the ship.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking and standing for approximately 1 kilometre, at times over uneven surfaces and several steps at the sites. Ålesund Walking Tour

Whilst walking through the winding streets, learn about the town's storied past, and marvel at the amazing buildings, decorations and colourful facades.

Art Nouveau Centre

A stop is made at the Art Nouveau Centre for a fascinating insight into Art Nouveau through authentic interiors and objects, as well as a captivating multimedia program called From Ashes to Art Nouveau. You can experience the devastating 1904 fire via film and photographs, and impressive sound and light effects. At the conclusion of your visit, commence the approximately 30-minute walk back to the pier.

Giske Island and Church

Next, proceed to the island of Giske, the seat of power during the Viking Age. Upon arrival, an external visit is made to the 12th-century Giske Church, a Romanesque marble church built as a private chapel for the famous Giske family.

Godøy Island and Alnes Village and Lighthouse

Following your visit, head to the island of Godøy and charming village of Alnes. Here, you can take a stroll through the village or climb the lighthouse for some spectacular panoramic views. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 30-minute drive back to the pier.

Borgundfjord, Storfjord, Sjøholt and Stordal

Depart the pier for the approximately three-hour drive to the Troll's Road, or 'Trollstigen'. En route, proceed along the Borgundfjord, passing charming suburbs and well-kept gardens. Next, follow the Big Fjord, or 'Storfjord', and pass the village of Sjøholt. Here, the fjord changes course as you head south into the Bay of Stordal, where the village of the same name is situated.

Valldal, Troll's Ladder, Trollstigen Viewpoint and Lunch

Upon arrival in the fertile valley of Valldal, see where strawberry cultivation takes place, then ascend the scenic valley to the Troll's Road, or 'Trollstigen' Viewpoint. Following a comfort and photo stop at the Trollstigen Viewpoint, which offers spectacular panoramic vistas of your surrounds.

Troll's Road and Stigerøra Waterfall

Re-board your coach for the drive down the Troll's Road. The Troll's Road is perched approximately 3,000 feet (about 900 metres) above sea level. This marvel of engineering features a winding road with 11 hairpin turns that snake their way down the mountain and through the valley. Descend the curves to the bottom of the valley, then stop to see the Stigerøra Waterfall cascading down the mountainside. From here, continue to the Troll Wall Viewpoint.

Troll Wall and Trollveggen Viewpoint

The Troll Wall, or 'Trollveggen' is the highest perpendicular rock face in Europe. It measures approximately 5,856 feet (about 1,785 metres) from the valley to the top of the wall. Out of this, approximately 3,248 feet (about 990 metres) are vertical.

together, with an approximately 148-foot (about 45-metre) overhang. Climbers from all over the world come here to try out the various routes to the top. Following a photo stop at the incredibly scenic Trollveggen Viewpoint, commence the approximately 2.5-hour drive back to Ålesund along the Romsdalsfjord, whose many small villages are noted for their woodcarving, rose-painting and ship-building. Next, cross over the ørskog Mountain Plateau, a popular skiing area in Ålesund, then follow the fjord once again and return to the pier.

Please Note: Occasionally the Troll Road has been closed by the Norwegian Roads Authority, due to safety concerns. In this case the tour itinerary has been adjusted and guests will be able to admire the road and its surrounding mountains from the Trollstigen viewpoint, which is accessible using alternative roads.

This tour involves extensive driving and is not recommended for guests who suffer from claustrophobia, vertigo and/or motion sickness. Tour may operate in reverse order.

Ålesund, Hessa Island, Sugarlump Mountain, Guided Hike

Depart the pier for the short drive through Ålesund en route to the base of Sugarlump Mountain, located on the island of Hessa approximately 2.5 miles (about four kilometres) from the city centre. Upon arrival, begin your one-hour, approximately 1.24-mile (about two kilometre) hike along a narrow nature trail. Your guided hiking tour starts at a height of approximately 164 feet (about 50 metres) above sea level, and ascends to the summit, which stands at approximately 997 feet (about 304 metres) above sea level.

Sugarlump Mountain Summit, Ålesund, Borgundfjord, Sunnmøre Alps, Open Sea, Islands

Afterward, hike back down to the base of Sugarlump Mountain, then re-board your coach for the short drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for approximately 1.24 miles (about two kilometres), at times over uneven surfaces and steep inclines, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. This tour is only suitable for in good physical conditions. Ålesund, RIB-Boat Adventure, Harbour, Coastal Waters, Open Seas, Runde Bird Rock

Depart the pier for the short walk to your awaiting rigid inflatable boat (RIB). After receiving your personal flotation device and safety and riding instructions, begin your approximately 90-minute RIB-boat adventure. Head out of the harbour and explore the coastal waters around Ålesund. In mild weather and with little wind, your captain ventures out as far as the Runde Bird Rock, crossing the open sea. If the sea is a little choppy, your captain stays within the sheltered waters of Ålesund.

Birdlife, Eagles, Seals, Marine Life

Along the way, look for the abundant local birdlife and an occasional eagle. Your captain searches for interesting wildlife, and manoeuvres the RIB-boat close to a rock to observe basking seals. The route taken is the captain's choice, depending on the

weather and fitness level of the guests. At the conclusion of your tour, disembark your RIB-boat and commence the short walk back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of physical activity. This tour is not suitable for pregnant guests, guest with neck and/or back problems, guests with heart and/or respiratory conditions, guests prone to motion sickness, guests with limited mobility, and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Walk to the Via Ferrata Starting Point

Safety Briefing & Via Ferrata Climb

At the starting point you will be briefed and provided with your climbing gears (helmet, safety harness with two carabineers). You will then begin your guided approximately 100 metre high route along the mountain ledges. The spectacular route involves exposed climbing on a large granite wall. Half way, there is a spacious bench perfect for a break. Enjoy the view and take a photo of the city below you and the North Sea. Your guide will ensure safe climbing and interesting facts about ålesund and surrounding nature will be given.

Once on the top on Mount Aksla, you will follow the beautiful city stairs back down to the park and the ship.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of physical activity and is only suitable for guests in extremely good physical conditions. Guests are advised to wear comfortable clothing in layers with hiking boots. No prior rock climbing experience is required to take part in the tour. Guests are advised to keep personal belongings at a minimum, since bags or backpacks are not allowed during the Via Ferrata climb. Guests may be able to leave their belongings at the bottom of the Via Ferrata. Minimum age to participate is 12 years old and children under 16 years old must be accompanied by an adult. Upon arrival, enjoy a tasting of pølse and stappe (Norwegian-style hot dog sausage with delicious, home-made mashed potatoes). No visit to Norway is complete without tasting a pølse. Leaving Stuen, walk along Kongensgate, the main thoroughfare of Ålesund. Marvel at the picturesque architecture of the Art Nouveau buildings lining the street and stop to explore the charming Pavilion, a historic landmark offering stunning views of the town and its surrounding landscapes.

Brosundet Hotel, Fish Soup, Trakokeriet Restaurant, Dessert Pastry, Aksla Viewpoint, Fjords

In a country renowned for its jaw-dropping natural settings, approaching remote Trandal village from Ålesund via the pristine waters of the Hjørundfjord, with the towering Sunnmøre Alps as backdrop, rivals any scene Norway has to offer. Expect a waterborne journey of about an hour each way by chartered boat. And be prepared for goosebumps; this is truly one of the most magnificent fjords you'll ever see.

The visual thrill won't stop once you arrive in Trandal, either. With some 80 minutes of free time here, you can experience the ultra-famous fjord swing at Christian Gaard, only accessible by boat or via a challenging hike. Have a seat, swing out, and have someone capture the ultimate photo of yourself on the swing with nothing but the dramatically jagged mountains and glistening fjord surrounding you in the frame \ an image no one will quite believe when you show it off at home.

While here, you'll also taste a locally produced aperitif crafted from regional ingredients, accompanied by a delicious local salmon wrap or flatbread. If you like, follow that up with a leisurely walk to drink in still more of this remarkable setting before it's time to reboard the boat for a return journey to Ålesund that's every bit as spectacular as the one that brought you here. Some of our guests have been known to balk at disembarking once at the pier \ but, alas, disembark you must. Until your next visit to the fjordlands, at least.

Please note: This easy activity includes very little required walking, with some discretionary time on foot at Christian Gaard, where there are gravel paths and a slight incline leading to the main venue. This excursion is not recommended for those who utilize a wheelchair or have limited mobility. Wear layered, weather-appropriate clothing and comfortable closed-toe shoes. Bring your preferred sun protection. Total duration can run longer than the stated 3.5 hrs, depending on wind and weather conditions. The order of sights and activities may vary.

ALE-Q / Ålesund by Trolley: Art Nouveau Charm & Panoramic Views

Begin your journey by boarding the charming trolley train at the pier and setting off on a scenic ride through the heart of Ålesund. The route winds through the city's narrow streets lined with elegant Art Nouveau architecture, then continues east past the historic wooden houses that remarkably survived the great city fire.

Mount Aksla Views and Refreshments

As the trolley climbs toward Mount Aksla, you'll pass notable landmarks such as Voldsdalen Church and the city's stadium. At the summit, enjoy a 40-minute pause to savor a coffee break while taking in the breathtaking panorama of Ålesund, its surrounding archipelago, and the majestic Sunnmørsalpene mountains.

Art Nouveau

Descending toward "Ålesundet" (now known as Brosundet), the ride takes you past a mix of small and grand Art Nouveau buildings that define the city's unique character. Finally, return to the ship, accompanied by sweeping views of Ålesund as your memorable journey concludes.

Please Note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking of approximately 300 metres. Commentary during the trolley ride is provided via a recorded audio system in English.

ALE-L / Flightseeing over Ålesund & Sunnmøre Alps

Been craving a truly unforgettable travel memory? Consider this one: the privileged birds-eye view of a flightseeing adventure over one of the Earth's most wondrous regions, Ålesund and the Sunnmøre Alps.

The drive from the pier to Ålesund Airport runs about 15 minutes and is followed by a 20-minute safety briefing and gear-up once at the helipad. Then it's up, up, and very much away.

Once in the air, you'll be able to fully take in the Art Deco beauty of Ålesund from overhead as it spans across Hessa, Aspøya, Nørvøya, Oksenøya, Ellingsøya, Humla, and Tørla islands. Gaze down on the intricacy of the region's Atlantic shoreline. Gasp at the rugged majesty of the Sunnmøre peaks, towering over the mysteriously dark fjords. Find yourself feeling as if life and time have become suspended, just as you are within this state-of-the-art aircraft piloted by a seasoned professional. And descend gently back to Earth 30 minutes later, feeling elated and perhaps even changed by the experience.

Please note: While undeniably adventurous, this outing requires very little effort on your part. There is one large step to negotiate when boarding/exiting the helicopter. This excursion is not suitable for guests with limited mobility nor recommended for those prone to motion sickness, airsickness, or anyone unable to board without assistance. Maximum passenger weight allowable is 260 lbs (118 kg). Operation of the helicopter flight is dependent on weather conditions, with visibility, viewpoints, and exact route subject to change as needed. Trollbryggeriet Brewery

Depart Ålesund and enjoy a 1.5-hour scenic drive through Norway's fjord landscapes to your first stop: Trollbryggeriet Brewery in Liabygda. Here, take a guided tour and sample five small-batch beers paired with traditional snacks from Stranda, renowned for its cured meats and regional delicacies.

Skarbø Gård Farm

Continue with a 15-minute drive to the ferry port and cross the majestic Storfjorden (15 minutes) before a 15-minute drive to Skarbø Gård, a historic farm specializing in artisanal cheeses and fresh apple cider. Learn the secrets behind their craft and enjoy a tasting of cider, cured ham, and farmhouse cheeses, followed by a farm-to-table lunch featuring soup, salad, and dessert-all sourced from the surrounding land.

Brennevinsgrova Distillery

Next, travel 45 minutes to Brennevinsgrova Distillery, where passionate distillers craft aquavit and spirits infused with local botanicals. Explore the copper stills and savour their signature creations.

Finally, drive 15 minutes to the Sykkylven ferry port for a short crossing (15 minutes) and continue with a 30-minute drive through Ålesund's city center back to the pier. During the ferry ride, enjoy a cherished Norwegian tradition: svele, a fluffy pancake served with butter and sugar, paired with coffee, a sweet finale to your culinary adventure.

ALE-P / Runde Island: Nature, Wildlife & Coastal Beauty

Immerse yourself in Norway's coastal beauty with a scenic journey to Runde Island.

Begin your adventure with a 30-minute drive to Sulesund ferry port, followed by a 30-minute ferry crossing to Hareid. From there, enjoy a 60-minute scenic drive along the edge of the Stokksund-Blikkvågane conservation area, where Norway's coastal landscapes offer fresh air and serene views.

Runde Island Environmental Center

Arriving at Runde Island, your experience starts at the Runde Environmental Center with a 60-minute presentation on the island's unique ecosystem. Learn about seabird life, ongoing research, and watch the documentary Silver of the Sea, which explores the wildlife and environment. You'll also discover the fascinating story of the Runde Treasure, one of Europe's largest gold finds, marking 300 years since the Akerendam shipwreck.

Bird Cliff Hike

Next, embark on a 3-hour hike (180 minutes) to the famous bird cliffs. The trail is steep but well maintained, with several stops to admire the views. At the top, near the nesting cliffs, enjoy time to watch seabirds, take photos, and savor your packed lunch overlooking the sea.

After this unforgettable nature experience, return with a 60-minute drive to Hareid, a 30-minute ferry ride back to Sulesund, and a final 30-minute drive to the port.

Please Note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking, and guests must be in good physical condition and must wear proper footwear. The total walking distance is approximately 4.5 kilometers, with the first 15 minutes being the hardest due to a steep incline. This portion of the trail is paved, and guides will walk at the guests' pace, making stops when needed. After the incline, the path becomes flatter, and many stops will be made both for rest and for guiding. Binoculars are provided, and sun protection is recommended. Guests should bring a small backpack for personal belongings, bottled water from the ship, and dress according to the weather (windbreaker and hiking boots recommended). In the event of cold or

rainy weather, lunch will be served at the Conservation Center instead of outdoors. The Environmental Center is happy to host guests who choose not to take part in the hike. For groups of more than 20 participants, the group will be split: one group will do the hike first while the other visits the exhibition, and then they will swap.

TRD-001 / Beer Tasting in Trondheim

Difficulty



Price: \$199 - Duration: 2.50 hr(s) Start 1:00 PM

Located just outside the city center of Trondheim, Austmann Brewery offers visitors a chance to experience one of Norway's most well-known craft breweries up close.

The tour begins with a brief introduction to Austmann's history - from its founding in 2013 by three friends, to its rapid growth and influence on the Norwegian beer scene. Be then guided through the brewery itself, where they can observe the production process and learn about the ingredients, brewing techniques, and philosophy behind Austmann's wide range of beers. The space blends industrial function with a cozy, creative atmosphere, often featuring local artwork and reclaimed materials.

The highlight of the visit is a guided tasting session in the taproom. Here, guests sample a curated selection of beers - often including both core offerings and limited seasonal brews. The staff provide insights into the different styles, flavor profiles, and the inspiration behind each beer.

The experience offers a relaxed and authentic look into Trondheim's craft beer culture, and a chance to engage with the people behind one of the city's most celebrated brewing operations. Conclude the tour with a pint in hands at the brewery's taproom before heading back to the ship.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking of approximately 500 metres at the brewery and is suitable for guests with mobility difficulties. Guests must be over 18 years old to participate in the tour.

TRD-002 / Hike Trondheim Wilderness

Difficulty



Price: \$99 - Duration: 4.00 hr(s) Start 8:30 AM

Leaving the city behind, head into the forests surrounding Trondheim and arrive at Bekken, where our hike begins. Follow a trail through the woods towards "Burmaklippen" (the Burma Cliff), a small but dramatic overhanging cliff known for its photo spot. As you approach, the cliff's overhang is nearly imperceptible but becomes clear from the northern side, an ideal vantage point for photographers. Note, however, that the cliff slopes slightly downward at the edge, which may feel challenging for those with a fear of heights.

After the photo stop, continue hiking through the forest to Månen Hill, reaching 349 meters above sea level. From here, enjoy panoramic views of Trondheim before making our way back along the same trail. The tour concludes with a return trip to the city center and awaiting ship.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for approximately 6 kilometres, at times over uneven and natural surfaces and hills. The total amount of time spent walking is approximately 2.5 hours. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear warm, comfortable clothing in layers with flat, closed-toe and non-slip hiking shoes, and bring sun protection, a weatherproof jacket. The tour operates in all weather conditions. Views are weather dependant.

TRD-003 / Kayak & Sauna Experience

As we paddle along, learn you some easy paddling techniques, and you get to enjoy the magnificent views of Trondheim's waterfront. But the fun doesn't stop there. We will take you to Nyhavnas floating sauna, where you can enjoy heated changing facilities and showers. Imagine relaxing your body and rebooting your senses in the midst of a new suburb of Trondheim being built, with the backdrop of Lade hill in the distance.

And what's a better way to end this amazing experience than taking a dip in the Trondheim Waterfront? Do like many Norwegians who do it daily. Whether you're a beginner or an experienced kayaker, this tour is for everyone who wants to have fun and enjoy the beauty of Trondheim.

Please Note: This tour requires an extensive amount of activity. Guests must be good swimmers and in good physical condition. It is not recommended for those guests who suffer from any back or heart problems. Previous kayaking experience is not required. Life jackets are provided and must be worn. Double kayaks are used. The tour operates in all weather conditions and guests are expected to get wet. Guests are advised to wear swimming suits and waterproof clothing and bring a towel and slippers. Guests are provided with a dry bag where to put all their belongings, since the kayak ride ends at a different place than the depart. Participants must be 6 years of age and children under 12 years must accompanied by a participating adult.

TRD-004 / Royal Trondheim

Begin with a drive through the heart of the city, passing streets of traditional wooden houses, before arriving at Nidaros Cathedral. Work on this magnificent medieval structure began in 1070 and it marks the burial site of the patron saint of Norway, St Olav. In ancient times kings of Norway were hailed at øretinget on the river Nidelva in Trondheim, but more recently kings and queens have either been crowned or blessed in the cathedral.

After a guided tour of the cathedral your tour continues to the adjacent Archbishop's Palace. It was the archbishop's main residence from the middle of the 12th century until the reformation in 1537 but now houses an archaeological museum and the crown jewels, which you can admire before continuing to your final stop.

Stiftsgården is one of the largest wooden buildings in Norway and was originally built in 1778 for the rich widow of the Privy Councillor. It is now a royal residence used by King Harald V and Queen Sonja when they visit the city. See the Throne Room and the Queen's Salon as well as some of the other 140 exquisitely decorated rooms before returning to the ship.

Please note: This tour is primarily conducted on foot, with guests walking between venues. Please note that the route includes cobblestone streets and a few steps along the way. Tour may operate in reverse order. The Royal Residence may close at short notice, in which case, the Gardens will be visited instead of the interior.

TRD-005 / Vintage Railway & Historical Mine

Difficulty



Price: \$249 - Duration: 7.00 hr(s) Start 9:00 AM

Travel by bus out of the city of Trondheim to reach the Løkken copper mines where you will receive a short orientation and be provided with a hard-hat and for your half mile walk through the mine. You will navigate gravel paths, steps and wooden

walkways as you absorb the atmosphere in the mine, which was in operation from 1654 to 1987. Today the caverns are quiet and the rocky surfaces drip with moisture, while a faint odour of sulphur lingers in the air.

After you resurface, you will board your vintage car on the narrow-gauge Thamshavn Railway, a museum-railway that attracts tourists from all over the world. Sit back and enjoy the ride on wooden-benched train cars, which date back to the turn of the century. This railroad was originally constructed to transport ore from the Løkken copper mines. During World War II, several attempts were made to sabotage the line, destroying the trains, and today you will see many memorials along the tracks that commemorate the past.

After this fun 20-minute journey, you will head to Orkanger to enjoy a delicious meal at the traditional Bårdshaug Mansion, before heading back to Trondheim. Once back at the city, visit the Nidaros Cathedral. Building of this cathedral begun in 1070 and finished in the 12th century. It's the largest Gothic-style cathedral in Scandinavia, and is built on the grave of Saint Olav, who introduced Christianity to Norway.

Once you have taken plenty of pictures, you will then board the bus for the return journey back to the ship through this pretty town.

Please note: This tour involves extensive walking and standing. Inside the mine, the paths are on plank walkways, and visitors must navigate two sets of stairs. The temperature in the mine is approximately 14 C (57 F), so please dress appropriately. This tour is not suitable for individuals with claustrophobia or those using wheelchairs.

TRD-007 / Trondheim's World War II Legacy

Difficulty



Price: \$199 - Duration: 3.00 hr(s) Start 1:00 PM

Uncover Trondheim's dramatic World War II history as you visit key sites that tell the story of life under Nazi occupation. Meet your guide and board your motor coach for a scenic drive to The Armoury, a fascinating military museum housed within the historic Archbishop's Palace. Here, explore an impressive collection of artifacts, including weapons, uniforms, and detailed exhibits, while learning about the city's wartime experiences.

Continue to the imposing Kristiansten Fortress, where you'll hear poignant stories of Norwegian patriots who were executed during the occupation. Your journey concludes at DORA, the massive German submarine bunker. Stroll around its vast concrete exterior, a stark reminder of the city's strategic importance during the war, before reboarding your coach for the return to your awaiting ship.

Please Note: This tour requires a moderate amount of standing and walking (on uneven ground at the fortress, otherwise paved).

TRD-A / Trondheim Walk (INCLUDED)

Difficulty



Duration: 2.50 hr(s) Start 9:30 AM and 1:00 PM

Discover one of the oldest cities in Norway during this picturesque, half-day excursion through Trondheim on-foot.

Trondheim

Depart the pier for your guided walking tour through Trondheim. One of Norway's oldest cities, Trondheim was founded by Viking King Olav Trygvason in 997. The city is situated at the estuary of the River Nid, and faces the wide Trondheim Fjord.

River Nid, Market Square and Nidaros Cathedral

During your stroll along the river, savour its village atmosphere and unique blend of ancient and modern architecture. Cross the Market Square, home of the statue of King Olav. An inside visit is made at the Nidaros Cathedral, a splendid, 12th-century Gothic structure. This impressive church is built over the grave of St. Olaf, and boasts gorgeous stained-glass windows.

Bakklandet and Old Town Bridge

Next, continue through the rehabilitated Old Town of Bakklundet, where many picturesque wooden houses are painted in vivid colours, and small cafés and pubs stand adjacent to exclusive restaurants. Pass by the bicycle elevator, then walk towards the River Nid with its charming, red-painted Old Town Bridge. From here, head down the street along the riverbank, and take in splendid views of the old warehouses lining it. At the conclusion of your walking tour, return to the pier on-foot.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking, at times over uneven and cobblestone surfaces and inclines and a few steps at the Nidaros Cathedral. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Comfortable, weather-appropriate clothing, flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. An inside visit to the Nidaros Cathedral may not be possible during church services.

TRD-B / Panoramic Trondheim (INCLUDED)

Difficulty



Duration: 2.00 hr(s) Start 8:30 AM, 11:15 AM, and 2:00 PM

Enjoy this panoramic sightseeing introduction of Trondheim, taking you past all the city sites, including the Nidaros Cathedral and Kristiansten Fortress.

Panoramic Drive

Driving through the city center you will pass many wooden buildings that are so typical of Trondheim, and you will see the statue of Viking King Olav, who founded the city in 977. Continue past the Folk Museum of Trøndelag that encircles the remains of "Sion", King Sverre's Palace, from approximately 1180. You will also see Stiftsgården, which is the 2nd largest wooden building in Scandinavia, built in 1778 and is now a royal residence. At the Fishmarket "Ravnkloa" you will see where the local fishermen sell fresh fish and seafood.

Photo Stop at Kristiansten Fortress

Leaving the city center, you will make a photo stop at Kristiansten Fortress. From its hillside location, the fortress has stood guard overlooking the city since 1681 and was used as a place of execution for Norwegian members of the Resistance during World War II.

Nidaros Cathedral

Returning to the city you will drive past the Nidaros Cathedral, Scandinavia's largest medieval building. The construction of the cathedral started in 1070 AD and is built over the grave of St. Olav. Therefore, the cathedral is an important destination for Christian pilgrims. The building has been destroyed several times by fire but has always been rebuilt. The oldest part of the cathedral dates back to the 12th century.

Sverresli View Point

During the tour you will have also make a brief photo stop at Sverresli view point where you are able to enjoy the scenery of the city from above.

The tour concludes at the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of optional walking for approximately 440 yards (about 400 metres), at times over uneven and cobblestone surfaces and inclines, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach, and a few steps at the Kristiansten Fortress. This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Comfortable, weather-appropriate clothing, flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended.

TRD-J / Trondheim by Boat & on Foot

Difficulty



Price: \$149 - Duration: 3.00 hr(s) Start 9:00 AM and 1:00 PM

Explore historic Trondheim via land and water during a scenic boat ride on the Nid River and a walking tour through the city.

Canal Cruise

Board your open-air boat for a cruise taking you through the canal and along Nid River. Cruise upriver between the colorful warehouses, the old bridge, the Kristiansten Fortress and to Nidaros Cathedral. After disembarking the boat at Ravnkloa, begin your guided walking tour through the city. Trondheim is one of Norway's oldest cities and on this walk you can savor its village atmosphere, with its characteristic blend of ancient and modern architecture.

Walking Tour

ADA-A / Scenic Rauma Railway with Golden Train

Experience the magnificent beauty of the expansive Romsdal range and fjord during this scenic, half-day excursion through the Rauma Valley.

Åndalsnes Village, Romsdalsfjord, Rauma Railway Station

Depart the pier for the short, guided walk to the Rauma Railway Station. Åndalsnes is a beautiful village situated on the Romsdalsfjord, and terminus for the Rauma Railway line connecting the Romsdal district with eastern Norway and the capital, Oslo. Åndalsnes Village was bombed and almost destroyed during World War II, but it has been rebuilt along modern lines. The scenery is dramatic; high mountains with jagged peaks surround the village.

Golden Train-Ride, River Rauma, Mount Romsdalshorn, Trolltindane, Troll Wall

Upon arrival at the Rauma Railway Station, your tour begins with a panoramic train-ride. Your route follows the renowned River Rauma, which abounds with salmon and has been a favourite amongst English anglers for more than a century. To the left, take in splendid views of the approximately 5,085-foot-high (about 1,550-metre-high) Mount Romsdalshorn. To the right is the Trolltindane, whose towering peaks reach a height of approximately 6,168 feet (about 1800 metres), and the Trollveggen, or 'Troll Wall', whose vertical, overhanging wall is over 3,281 feet (about 1,000 metres) in height.

Lesjaskog Lake, Waterfalls, Kylling Bridge, Bjorli Railway Station, Valley, Troll Wall

Next, continue through the fascinating landscape along the River Rauma that descends from the Lesjaskog Lake, and forms many attractive waterfalls on the way. Norwegian Traditions

Depart by coach and drive just a short distance (10 minutes) to the lovely Woldstad Farm. Receive an introduction to what life is like on an old family farm, with a window on its history as well as the chance to experience Norwegian culture for yourself. Your host encourages questions, as the farm owners are passionate about sharing how life in this challenging (yet scenically beautiful) place has changed over the centuries.

Local Tasting & Svele Baking

Enjoy a tasting of local specialties made on the farm as well as produce grown here. Try the svele (a traditional, thick pancake), or some apple or blueberry pie, along with locally-made cheese and homemade jams.

Take some time to wander the agricultural farm on your own, taking pictures or just absorbing the beauty of the setting. Return to the pier.

Please note: This excursion involves a moderate amount of walking, mainly at guests' discretion. The tour is suitable for guests with mobility difficulties and wheelchair users as long as they can negotiate the steps on and off the coach. Romsdalen Gondola

The Romsdalen Gondola is Norway's longest cable car, and the bottom station is located right in the center of the mountaineering capital Åndalsnes. It has been built with innovative and sustainable solutions, and opened in May 2021.

Meet your guide on the pier, who will take you for a brief walk to the cable car station, where your short but incredible ride will begin.

Nesaksla Mountain Nature Walk

Upon arrival at the Nesaksla mountain, follow your guide through some of the several hiking trails, featuring spectacular views of the fjords, your ship and majestic mountains. Walk for approximately 1 kilometre, while listening to your guides commentary. The hike ends at the gondola station at the top of the mountain, where you may choose to further enjoy the spectacular mountain views before taking the gondola down the mountain and returning to the pier.

Please note: This excursion involves an extensive amount of walking of approximately 2 kilometres, over uneven ground and natural surfaces. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are recommended to wear walking shoes and dress in layers. At the end of the nature walk, guests may opt to stay longer at the top station, try out different walking trails or have some refreshments at their own expense. When you reach about 430m above sea level the trail steepens into stone steps, where the path is made durable thanks to wonderful pieces of stone construction works by Nepalese Sherpas. Worth a study itself, called Romsdalstrappa, the steps provide a solid path most of the way to the top. The path is well marked with signposts and red marks painted on trees and rocks.

Rampestreken View Point

From the Rampestreken view point, enjoy a 360 degrees view over the fjord, mountains and your ship.

On the way back return via the same hiking trail, climbing down the steps.

Please note: This tour requires an extensive amount of activity and is suitable only for those guests who are physically fit and experienced at hiking. Wear hiking boots, dressing in layers and bringing along sun screen or rain gear if necessary. A little waist or back pack may be helpful to carry water from the ship, camera and clothing accessories as needed. Walking is on steps, hiking paths, grass and uneven surface, uphill and downhill. The strenuous hike up to the view point will take approximately 90 minutes, while the hike down back to the pier will take approximately one hour, however overall duration may change depending on the fitness level of the group. The tour is not recommended to guests with fear of heights and to guests with knees problems. Guests who are struggling with the steep downhill hike, may opt to return to the ship using the cable car at their own expense. The tour operates in all weather conditions.

OLD-C / Briksdal Glacier with Trollcars

Difficulty

Glacial Lakes and Valleys

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 40-minute drive to the Briksdal Mountain Lodge. En route, drive through the valley along the shore of the Floen and Olden lakes. Ahead of you, view the long white stretch of the Melkevoll Glacier. The road ascends through woodlands to the Briksdal Mountain Lodge at the end of the road.

The first part of the drive is somewhat steep, but the uneven terrain flattens out upon reaching the highlight of your tour, the Briksdal Glacier itself. A stop is made here to take in the stunning beauty of this imposing natural wonder. Afterward, drive back the same route back to the Briksdal Mountain Lodge. Following a refreshment stop with coffee and cakes and some time to browse the gift shop, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 45-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking only in the Briksdal Glacier, at times over uneven surfaces and inclines, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. This tour is not recommended for guests who utilise a wheelchair. Weather appropriate clothing, preferably in layers and weather proof (rain jacket and trouser in case of rain) with flat, closed-toe walking shoes are recommended.

OLD-G / Briksdal Glacier Hike

Glacial Lakes and Valleys

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 40-minute drive to the Briksdal Mountain Lodge. En route, drive through the valley along the shore of the Floen and Olden lakes. Ahead of you, view the long white stretch of the Melkevoll Glacier. The road ascends through woodlands to the Briksdal Mountain Lodge at the end of the road.

Hike Briksdal and Jostedal Glaciers

Upon arrival, begin your hike to Briksdal Glacier. After crossing the river, climb the lovely scenic switchback path to the top of a waterfall. Here, take in the view of the Briksdal Glacier, the largest arm of the Jostedal Glacier, the largest glacier on the European mainland.

Briksdal Glacier and Mountain Lodge

A stop is made here to take in the stunning beauty of this imposing natural wonder. Afterward, walk back the same route back to the Briksdal Mountain Lodge. Following a refreshment stop with coffee and cakes and some time to browse the gift shop, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 45-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of approximately 5 kilometres in total, over uneven surfaces and inclines, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. This tour is not recommended for mobility challenged guests or guests who utilise a wheelchair. Wear hiking boots, dressing in layers and bringing along sun screen or rain gear if necessary.

Marvel in the sublime views of the Nordfjord, Norway's sixth longest fjord, and Hornindal Lake, Europe's deepest lake.

Robbjørgane & Nos Viewpoints

Relax as your journey through the spectacular scenery of the Nordfjord region.

This scenic excursion starts in the charming village of Olden right at the head of the Nordfjord penetrating some 110 kilometres deep into the country.

Winding your way through the quaint villages and rugged mountains, enjoy a photo stop at Robbjørgane. Continue to Nos viewpoint, boasting magnificent views from over 1,600 feet above sea level.

Hornindal Lake

After admiring your remarkable surroundings, your journey will continue along the stunning fjord. As you approach the end of Nordfjord, turn inland via Nordfjordeid towards Lake Hornindal. As well as Europe's deepest lake (1,686 ft), this vast body of water is Europe's clearest lake, as it contains no glacial runoff.

Finally, with lake panoramas framed by snow-capped mountains, make your way back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking and is recommended for mobility challenged guests or guests who utilise a wheelchair as long as they can negotiate the steps on and off the coach. Weather appropriate clothing, preferably in layers and weather proof (rain jacket and trouser in case of rain) with flat, closed-toe walking shoes are recommended. The tour includes several tunnels and is not suitable for guests suffering from vertigo.

Loen Gondola

Upon arrival at Loen you will board the gondola and ride up the mountain. Within 5 minutes you will reach the top at 1011 meters above sea level. From the top of the mountain enjoy magnificent views over the end of the Nordfjord region and the beginning of the Jostedal Glacier National Park.

You will have approximately 45 minutes of time at your leisure to explore the viewing area, browse the gift shop and enjoy some traditional Norwegian refreshments at your own expense.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking, at times over uneven and natural surfaces. Walking at the Loen Gondola top station is at the discretion of each guest. This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear warm, comfortable clothing in layers with flat, closed-toe and non-slip walking shoes, and bring sun protection, a weatherproof jacket, umbrella, bottled water, and credit cards and/or local currency for purchases from the ship.

As you glide through the fjord, get an up-close experience of the breathtaking landscapes of the villages of Olden, Stryn, and Loen, nestled among the steep mountains, blue glaciers, and waterfalls created by melting snow and glaciers. Learn a bit of Viking history and culture as your guide shares insights about the seafaring warriors who once sailed these waters.

All too soon, it's time to sail back to the village pier.

Please note: As this is an active adventure, it is not suitable for pregnant women and guests with heart, back or neck problems, or conditions which may be affected by the fast, bumpy ride of the watercraft. It is not wheelchair accessible, and guests must be physically able to board the RIB boat. For your safety and comfort, all necessary gear is provided (floatation suit, life vest, hat, gloves, and goggles). It is recommended that guests dress in warm layers and wear flat, closed-toe shoes. OLD-E / Jostedals Glacier by Helicopter

Experience the breath-taking natural scenery and panoramic vistas of Norway from a unique perspective during this captivating flight-seeing excursion.

Olden, Innvikfjord and Nordfjord

Depart the pier for the short drive to the helipad in Tyvaneset. Upon arrival, receive your safety instructions, board your helicopter and lift-off for your approximately 30 minutes, narrated flight-seeing tour. Your route begins over Olden, which lies at the head of the Innvikfjord, a branch of the Nordfjord.

Jostedals Glacier

Next, fly over the Jostedals Glacier, the largest glacier on mainland Europe. This glacier has 22 named outlets, or 'glacial arms' or 'tongues', many of which are accessible from Olden. The area offers spectacular scenery, shaped over thousands of years by glacial erosion. Faults and fractures underneath the glacier have carved out valleys and mountain passes.

Myklebust Glacier, Briksdal Glacier, Brenndal Glacier

Highlights to be seen during your helicopter flight-seeing tour include the Myklebust Glacier, Briksdal Glacier, Brenndal Glacier, eastern part of the Nordfjord, Loen valley and Lake Loen. At the conclusion of your tour, return to the helipad, re-board your car and commence the short drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking; however, guests must negotiate the steps to board/de-board the helicopter. This tour is not suitable for guests with a fear of heights, guests prone to airsickness, guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. While eating Signe will talk about the food, how it is prepared, stored and cooked for you, following ancient traditions. You will get to know the different ways food has been preserved and passed on from generation to generation.

After a very fascinating visit, reboard your coach driving down the valley and back to the pier.

VIK-A / Iconic Norway: Flåm Railway & Scenic Fjordland

Difficulty

This full-day outing combines the exhilaration of a world-famous mountain railway ride with the intriguing iconography of a medieval Viking, plus multiple waterfalls, idyllic fjordside villages, and more. It begins with a lengthy and wonderfully scenic drive across the lush Vestland landscape and into steep and narrow Flåm Valley. There, you'll enjoy an early buffet lunch before walking to the Flåm train station to begin the thrill ride component of your day.

The famous Flåm Railway is one of the steepest railways in the world, ascending from sea level to 2,700 ft elevation in just 45 minutes \ and offering truly breathtaking views of dramatic cascades, rugged cliffs, and deep ravines throughout the journey. Stepping off briefly at Kjosfossen waterfall, snap some close-up photos and breathe in the splendor of this spot. Ahead is Myrdal Station, where you'll transfer to the Bergen Railway for a second remarkable mountain-crossing journey that skirts dramatic drops and past torrenting rivers to reach Voss, a village where adventure sport is a year-round obsession.

Have some free time to explore and enjoy a refreshment stop, before reboarding your coach for the two-hour return drive toward Vik. And it's a stunner \ winding around sharp bends and through tunnels, traversing the rugged Vika Mountain landscape with panoramas of the Sognefjord and Vik in the distance. En route, stop to admire multi-stranded Tvinde Waterfall as it cascades down the sheer cliff face.

One more landmark remains on the agenda: the spectacular 12th-century Hopperstad Stave Church just outside Vik. Despite being portrayed in fiction as wildly barbaric, the Vikings were key to the spiritual development of early Norway. From here, the pier is just 10 minutes away.

Please note: This moderate excursion involves about 2km of walking throughout the day and periods of standing at the visited sites. Guests must be able to board the coaches without assistance. This excursion includes extensive driving. Several tunnels are transited. Wear weather-appropriate, comfortable clothing, and bring your preferred sun protection and best camera. The order of sights and activities may vary. Hopperstad Stave Church is visited from the outside only.

Due to train schedule, the tour will include an early buffet brunch at approximately 11am, guests are recommended to have a light breakfast.

VIK-B / Arnafjord by RIB

Embark on a journey of a lifetime cruising the emerald green waters of the stunning Sognefjord. After a safety briefing and instructions, you'll suit up in a protective, wind-proof outfit and board your Rigid Inflatable Boat (RIB), setting off on a truly unforgettable adventure. This lightweight, high-performance boat can ideally navigate the varying conditions and bring you up close to nature's surprises, maneuvering through narrow waterways and uncovering hidden treasures.

First, cruise down the breathtaking Arnafjord, a lushly landscaped arm of Sognefjord known for its many cascading waterfalls and lush green sprawling mountain landscapes. Incredibly vibrant in the spring and summer, you'll encounter small farms, including the hill farm Bungane, perched on a mountain ledge almost 500 meters above the fjord.

Next, continue down the most remote arm of Sognefjord, Finna fjord, or hidden fjord known for its lush, nearly untouched nature. Journey across this part of the Stølsheimen Landscape Conservation Area and pass through a small tidal current,

experiencing how a fjord system functions with the passing tidal changes. Then, you'll cruise through a narrow straight to come onto what many consider paradise on Earth, Finnabotnen.

Here in this remote, barely touched by modern society wonderland, mountains plunge into the mirror-like fjord, and the only sounds heard are those of the wind, birds, and waterfalls. Far from road access, this spectacular fjord's small farms and magnificent sites are hidden gems few will ever experience. Revel in the peaceful beauty with dramatic steep mountainsides all around \ some of the most beautiful scenery Fjord Norway has to offer. Your RIB returns you to the pier and to rejoin the ship.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of activity and good physical condition, including the physical ability to sustain a fast and often bumpy boat ride, making this tour less recommended for guests with limited mobility and not accessible for guests who utilise walkers or a wheelchair. This tour is not recommended for those with neck or back conditions. Minimum age to participate is 12, and there is a weight restriction of approximately 300 lbs per guest. Guests are recommended to wear comfortable clothes and shoes with non-slip soles, and to bring a towel and bottled water. Space on this tour is limited; we suggest you book well in advance to avoid disappointment. Wildlife sightings are likely but not guaranteed.

VIK-C / Fjords & Glacier

Experience the spectacular fjord and ice landscape of Norway firsthand as you visit an arm of the massive Jostedalsbreen Glacier and explore the country's award-winning center for glacier and environmental knowledge, the Norwegian Glacier Museum in Fjaerland.

From Vikøyri, a brief 20-minute drive brings you to Vangsnes pier, where you'll board the local ferry for a short but immensely scenic crossing over the Sognefjord to Hella, on the other side. From there, get ready for an abundance of impressive fjordland scenery as your drive continues for about 90 minutes en route to Fjærland Valley. You'll skirt the Norafjorden and narrower Sogndalsfjorden, pass through the Sogndal Valley, and traverse two tunnels cut straight through the mountains \ witnessing a landscape sculpted by glaciers over several million years and through successive ice ages.

Stopping at Bøyabreen, an optional short walk allows you to see an arm of the mighty Jostedalsbreen Glacier up close. Bøyaglacier is a prodigious icefall capable of crawling up to 6 ft / 2 m a day, making it one of the fastest-moving glaciers in Norway. That constant motion leads to frequent "talking" \ the audible rumbling heard as the ice shifts down the mountainside. A visit to the Glacier Museum will deepen your understanding of how this wondrous landscape of glaciers and fjords was created, how it has evolved over eons, and how climate affects its behavior today. As architecturally fascinating as it is packed with glaciological exhibits, this award-winning venue even allows you to interact hands-on with 1000-year-old ice from nearby Supphellebreen.

A coffee break in Brævasshytta will warm you up at the outing's midpoint, and the return by coach and ferry retraces the same route \ its terrain now more understandable thanks to the new knowledge you've just acquired.

Please note: This moderate excursion involves about 0.6 mi/ 0.9 km of walking, about half of which is optional at the glacier viewpoint. Guests must be able to board the coach unassisted. Vehicles are not wheelchair accessible; chairs can be placed in the luggage compartment. Wear weather-appropriate clothing and flat, closed-toe shoes. A windbreaker is recommended. A coffee and snack stop is included. Note that this excursion involves extensive driving, including some sections through tunnels. The order of sights and activities may vary.

VIK-D / A Trek To Hovsåsen Viewpoint

If you appreciate exceptional natural scenery and the invigorating challenge of a self-powered trek, this outing fits the bill perfectly. Led by an experienced local guide who knows the region well, you'll ascend to a stunning green viewpoint on Hovsåsen Plateau and enjoy a hotel-crafted box lunch up there before descending back to sea level some 4.5 hours and 7.5 mi

/12 km later. Along the way, two very ancient landmark churches \ one of wood, one of stone \ will be among the sights encountered.

Your trek begins at sea level and eventually reaches about 1,000 ft /300 m at the high point. Starting out from the pier, you'll first make a brief stop to pick up your water and food at the Blix Hotel in Vik before heading out into the pastoral Vestland terrain. During a fairly steep 90-minute ascent, you'll pass the two 11th-century landmarks \ Hopperstad Stave Church and Hove Stone Church \ along with burial mounds and other fascinating sights. Enjoy a 30-minute lunch break and the opportunity to capture fantastic photos of the village from high atop the plateau before the return descent begins \ leading you through a lush rural landscape shaped by the vast glaciological forces of the Ice Age.

Some 90 minutes later, you'll be back at the ship \ tired perhaps, but energized for sure.

Please note: This adventure activity involves extensive walking over natural terrain, approximately 7.5 mi / 12 km in total, with an altitude gain of about 1,000 ft / 300 m. Guests must be in good physical shape to participate and length of the excursion may vary according to group's overall conditioning. Wear weather-appropriate clothing and sturdy walking /hiking shoes; bring your preferred sun and wind protection. Bottled water and a boxed lunch of sandwiches, fruit, and Norwegian chocolate will be provided by the Blix Hotel at beginning of hike. The order of sights and activities may vary. This tour may be canceled should weather conditions be unfavorable.

VIK-E / Tvinde Waterfall, Gudvangen, And Viking Church

Buried Church and Old Town

Continue onto the other side is the old part of Copenhagen, lining one of the city's many winding canals. Pass the old Stock Exchange - a building in Dutch renaissance style, with its spire of entwined dragon tails. Further on, pass the Christiansborg Palace, home of the Danish Parliament and the King's Reception rooms, and pass the GL Strand.

Glyptoteket, Tivoli Gardens, Rosenborg

Pass the Glyptotek Art Museum with an impressive collection of art, bestowed on the city by the heir of the Carlsberg Empire, and the massive National Museum founded in 1650 and housed in the old Prince's Palace. On the other side of the City Hall Square is the world famous Tivoli Gardens, founded in 1843 and thus one of the oldest amusement parks still in operation in the world. Then pass the Rosenborg Castle, probably the quaintest and most fairy tale-like of all the Copenhagen castles.

After this scenic overview of the Danish capital, continue to the airport for your onward travel

Please note: This tour is offered to guests disembarking the ship with flights from Copenhagen International Airport at 2pm or later and will end at the airport. It requires a minimal amount of walking. Copenhagen City Tour

After departing from the pier make a brief photo stop to the diminutive statue, which has become the world famous symbol of Copenhagen; the statue of the Little Mermaid who gazes longingly out to sea from her rock in the harbour. Pass the Citadel and Historic housing area of before continuing on.

The next photo stop will be at Amalienborg, the royal winter residence. The sprawling octagonal courtyard, linking four rococo mansions and the impressive Marble Church, is regarded as one of Europe's finest examples of the staging of Absolutism and widely considered one of the most beautiful squares in Europe.

Drive through the colourful canal area of Nyhavn, once a disreputable quarter of the city frequented by sailors and consisting of bars and entertainment of questionable taste. It is now a most charming part of Copenhagen, with brightly coloured houses along the canal. Pass the old Stock Exchange - a building in Dutch renaissance style, with its spire of entwined dragon tails. Further on, pass the Christiansborg Palace, home of the Danish Parliament and the Queen's Reception rooms, and pass the GL Strand.

Rosenborg Castle

Rosenborg Castle, probably the quaintest and most fairy tale-like of all the Copenhagen castles, with its tall towers and its red masonry with sandstone ornaments, as a distinguished example of Christian IV's many building projects, perfect despite many changes during its construction history. The Castle is built in the special Dutch Renaissance style which became typical of Danish buildings during this period.

Explore the castle on a guided tour, including the collection of crown jewels and other Royal regalia. The interiors are well-preserved and invite you to take a journey in time.

After this scenic overview of the Danish capital, return to the pier and your awaiting ship.

Copenhagen, Langelinie Yacht Marina and Little Mermaid

Receive your safety and bicycling instructions, then depart the pier for a guided tour of Copenhagen City via bicycle, the most popular form of transport among Copenhageners. Riding along the harbour-front, pass by the Langelinie Yacht Marina for a photo stop at the city's world-famous resident, the 'Little Mermaid'.

Amalienborg Palace and Garden, Nyhavn Canal, King's Garden, Royal Theatre, Rosenborg Castle

Next, ride along the green park and continue on to the modern, yet elegant Amalie Garden, with the Queen's Palace, Amalienborg, right behind the square. After a photo stop here, ride on to the Nyhavn Canal. Formerly the sailors' quarter, Nyhavn is today a fashionable promenade with restaurants and bars, but has managed to retain its historic, seafaring aura. From here, cross the King's New Square, where the Royal Theatre is located, and ride past the King's Garden, the lush green park adjacent to Rosenborg Castle, an elegant Renaissance castle dating from the 17th century.

Christiansborg Castle, Old Stock Exchange, City Hall, Market Halls, and Danish Specialities

Your route proceeds past Christiansborg Castle, houses the Danish Parliament and is located next to the Old Stock Exchange. From here, ride past City Hall en route to the newly-opened Market Halls. A stop is made here for a tasting of Scandinavian and Danish specialities. Afterward, commence the short ride back to the pier, passing the historic, yellow-painted houses of Nyboder en route.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of bicycling for approximately 6.2 miles-7.4 miles (about 10 kilometres-12 kilometres) and a moderate amount of walking for approximately 547 yards (about 500 metres). Pass Christiansborg Castle, which was built by King Christian IV, houses the Danish Parliament and is located next to the Old Stock Exchange. From here, sail through the open harbour and see Nyhavn from a distance whilst passing by the Playhouse. During the tour, wine and canapes are served. Your scenic evening cruise concludes back at the pier. After disembarking the boat, return to the ship on-foot.

Copenhagen, Little Mermaid Statue

After a photo stop at the Little Mermaid, re-board your coach and take a sightseeing drive through the city.

Gefion Fountain, Nyhavn, King's Square, Royal Theatre, Old Fish Market

Along the way, pass by Copenhagen's famous Gefion Fountain, set amidst the parkland of the Citadel and depicting the Nordic legend of the Goddess Gefion. Drive through the bustling Nyhavn area. Here, see King's Square, where the Royal Theatre, embassies and many fashionable shops are located, along with the Old Stock Exchange and Gammel Strand. In addition, view the old fish market warehouses dating back to medieval times and Glyptoteket, founded by the Danish Brewer, Carl Jacobsen, the creator of Carlsberg beer. Following your sightseeing drive, head to the final stop on your tour, Tivoli Gardens.

Tivoli Gardens, Rosenborg Castle

Founded in 1843 by Georg Carstensen, Tivoli was inspired by the so-called romantic pleasure gardens of Europe. When Tivoli first opened its gates, it only had a few rides and amusements; today, however, there is a mix of attractions mingled with

charming flower and relaxation gardens. One of the most photographed features of Tivoli is the Chinese Pagoda, which dates from 1900 and is situated beautifully by the lake. The fairy-tale writer Hans Christian Andersen was a frequent visitor to Tivoli, and some say that it was here he was inspired to write *The Nightingale*. Some free time is made available here to enjoy the fun, frivolity and excitement of Tivoli at your leisure. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 30-minute drive back to the pier, passing by the Rosenborg Castle en route.
