DEAUVILLE & PAYS D'AUGE

HIGHLIGHTS

- Enjoy a drive along a section of the Normandy coast known as the Côte Fleurie for its colorful resorts.
- Stop in for a stroll in Deauville, the long-famous resort town with a 1920s boardwalk and striped beach tents oozing with retro French style.
- Shift gears on a jog inland to the Pays d'Auge apple orchard region, for a visit and tour of Château du Breuil and its Calvados distillery.
- See where their delicious brandies are carefully blended and aged in oak – and enjoy a sample tasting.

DESCRIPTION

This delight excursion takes you along a stretch of the chic Parisian Riviera coastline and inland to a venerable Calvados brandy chateau. The pleasure begins with a scenic drive along the Côte Fleurie – the Flowery Coast – passing tony resorts that burst with vibrant color every summer. Foremost among these sunny, stylish gems is Deauville, transformed into an early vacation mecca by Napoleon III's half-brother more than 150 years ago. After an orientation spin through town by coach, you'll have some free time to see for yourself that Deauville's still got it. A walk along the Promenade des Planches boardwalk should do the trick. Then it's off to the lush inland Pays d'Auge region, ripe with apple orchards and home to lovely slate-roofed Château du Breuil. Dating from the 16th century, this elegant estate has been home to many notable families – and continues to produce a notably award-winning family of Calvados apple brandies. Each is aged in carefully selected oak casks in the castle cellars and by the end of your tour, you will have the sampled the delectable result. It's sure to put a smile on your face, as will the scenery on the return drive to Honfleur.

CORMELLES & CALVADOS TASTING & HONFLEUR

HIGHLIGHTS

- Tour a Calvados distillery and sample its premium apple cider-based brandy.
- Explore Cormeilles, an inland town known for its half-timbered houses and antique shopping.
- Spend free time in Honfleur, where you may browse the shops in the Old Harbor.

DESCRIPTION


Enjoy the alluring architecture of Cormeilles and a tasting of Calvados brandy as a prelude to spending free time in Honfleur. Chances are, you will see apple orchards on the way to the Busnel Distillery, one of the premier producers of Calvados from apple cider pressed in Normandy. After an enlightening tour of the distillery, you will sample its amber-hued Calvados, a drink with a high alcohol content whose popularity soared when an insect infestation devastated France's vineyard in the late 1800s. Ahead lies Cormeilles, an immensely charming village on the River Calonne known for its centuries-old half-timbered houses. The Church of Sainte Croix is another architectural highlight, as the historical church was constructed with a noticeable slope from the nave up to the altar. Besides being wonderfully atmospheric, the village also offers excellent shopping, particularly for antiques. You will also have time to browse the shops in the Old Harbor district of Honfleur.

D-DAY LANDING BEACHES AND LUNCH AT LE BOTANISTE

HIGHLIGHTS

- See World War II sites that commemorate the Allied efforts in the pivotal D-Day invasion.
- Marvel at the floating Mulberry Harbors that allowed supplies to be safely unloaded.
- Pause to reflect at the Allied cemetery above Omaha Beach.
- Behold the sheer cliff that Allied troops scaled to disarm the German artillery.
- Dine at the elegant restaurant Le Botaniste.

DESCRIPTION

Spend the day visiting some of the most significant and moving sites that commemorate the D-Day invasion, starting at the seaside village Arromanches. There you will see the Allied-built Mulberry Harbors, ingenious floating piers and roadways that served as artificial harbors, allowing supplies to be safely unloaded for the ground troops. At the cemetery above Omaha Beach in Colleville Saint Laurent, you will pause to reflect at the final resting place of nearly 9,400 soldiers who died during the Normandy campaign. Walking among the sea of marble crosses and Stars of David will be deeply moving. You will also see a memorial inscribed with the names of another 1,557 American soldiers missing during the D-Day invasion. Then, there is Pointe du Hoc. American soldiers used rope ladders to scale a 100-foot cliff there during D-Day and disarm the German artillery that would have fired on the troops landing at Omaha Beach. A simple granite pylon monument marks the spot.

CANADIAN LANDING BEACHES

HIGHLIGHTS

- Visit key sites in the D-Day invasion where Canadian soldiers fiercely battled.
- Gain insight into the challenges that the soldiers faced as they landed at Juno Beach.
- Watch a movie that depicts the roles and sacrifices of the Canadian infantry soldiers.
- Pause to reflect at the cemetery where thousands of Canadian soldiers are buried.

DESCRIPTION

Gain a deeper understanding of the immense contributions of the Canadian soldiers that fought in the D-Day invasion by visiting a memorial center and a Canadian cemetery. You will first see where the Canadian 3rd Infantry Division landed in Juno Beach on June 6, 1944. Besides the offshore reefs and shoals that impeded their landing, the Canadians faced mined beach obstacles and the entrenched German troops. You will learn details of the mission while visiting the Juno Beach Centre, a memorial to all the Canadians that served during World War II. You will also watch a movie as part of an immersive experience that re-enacts the roles and sacrifices of the Canadian infantry soldiers during D-Day and the Battle of Normandy. Later, you will pause to reflect at the Bény-sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery, the final resting place for more than 2,000 Canadian soldiers that lost their lives during the D-Day invasion. It is a sobering memorial.

ACCESSIBLE HONFLEUR HARBOR AND TOWN CENTER

HIGHLIGHTS

- • Explore Honfleur’s engaging old harbor, which has been wonderfully restored.
- • Get an authentic view of daily life as you meander about the bustling harbor area.
- • See an unusual 15th-century church with a ceiling shaped like an upside-down boat.
- • Browse a hilltop church where Napoleon once worshipped and take in the sweeping views

DESCRIPTION

Delve deeply into the history of Honfleur by strolling through the beautifully restored old harbor and browsing landmark churches in the town center and beyond. The harbor is rimmed with narrow 16th-century houses and is usually bustling, so it offers a candid snapshot of everyday life. A stone building known as the Lieutenancy stands at one end. When French impressionist Claude Monet lived in Honfleur, he beautifully captured the Lieutenancy in oil on canvas. You will surely notice Honfleur’s maritime influence at Sainte Catherine Church, the country’s largest wooden church with a separate bell tower. Shipbuilders constructed it in the 15th century with a timbered ceiling that resembles an upside-down boat. You will also visit Notre Dame de Grace, an even older church where the likes of explorer Samuel de Champlain and Napoleon Bonaparte have worshipped. The hilltop site offers an excellent view of the old harbor and the Seine River.

This tour is designed to use the most wheelchair accessible routes possible. This includes step-free routes, shorter distances and no stairs. Accessible restrooms with wide doors for wheelchairs are present along the tour route. The vehicle used on this excursion is adapted with an access ramp (or lift where available) to accommodate a limited number of wheelchairs and/or mobility scooters. Guides are not allowed to push wheelchairs. Guests needing special assistance must be accompanied by an able-bodied companion. Lunch/snack costs are not included. CAEN & THE PEACE MEMORIAL

HIGHLIGHTS

- Journey across Normandy terrain to a medieval city that required a complete rebuild after World War II.
- Become interactively immersed in history as you visit the Cain Memorial, a venue uniquely dedicated to peace and reconciliation.
- Learn the full story of the underpinnings that led to the D-Day Landings and Battle of Normandy.
- Spend approximately two hours at this thought-provoking memorial – and remember it for far longer.

DESCRIPTION

After a scenic drive across the Normandy countryside, visit a museum dedicated to peace in a town that endured – and survived – one of WWI’s fiercest battles. Caen is barely 10 miles inland from the Normandy beaches, and control of this medieval university city quickly became strategic to both sides after the June 1944 landings. With the Germans stubbornly entrenched in defensive position, Caen was subjected to a month of intense Allied bombardment and shelling – with the loss of thousands of civilian lives and three-quarters of the city’s buildings. The Caen Memorial was created as a place for reflecting on war and reconciliation in a larger sense than even the unforgettable events that happened here. It is a museum that explores the nature of conflict – and commemorates peace. Utilizing a participatory approach to presents the stakes involved in the Second World War and the course and significance of its outcome, you will be immersed in a multimedia, historical setting that brings the action vividly to life.

FECAMP & ETRETAT

HIGHLIGHTS

- Travel to the Benedictine Palace in Fécamp, where the herbal liqueur of the same name is made.
- Enjoy a tour of this sprawling, ornate venue built by the eccentric wine trader who “rediscovered” a monk’s lost formula in 1863 and used it to create his trademark product.
- Walk through the Palace’s aromatic facilities and cellars, then sip some Benedictine yourself.
- Take a drive along Normandy’s scenic Alabaster Coast to visit and tour Étretat, a charming town framed by dramatic chalk cliffs and sea arches.

DESCRIPTION

Travel by coach to the grand art-filled palace where Benedictine liqueur is made and walk a coastal town that epitomizes the chalky cliffs of Normandy. Beginning by highway, the road soon shifts to breezy headlands and wooded valleys as you approach the ancient fishing harbor of Fécamp. Just a few blocks in from the marina waits the vast Benedictine Palace – begun in 1880 but paying ornate homage to sumptuous Gothic and Renaissance style. It was built to house the distillery and extensive art collection of a local wine trader who rediscovered the lost recipe for a popular herbal liqueur made by monks in the town abbey until the Revolution. Today, the Palace still makes its trademark Benedictine, flavored by 27 aromatic herbs and spices. You’ll briefly tour the Palace and its eccentric on-site museum as well as pass through the laboratory and cellars, where you can sample their famous liqueur for yourself. Then it’s time to drive along the Côte d’Albâtre, or Alabaster Coast, to a marvelously scenic little seaside town revered for its sheer white cliffs and milky waters, along with several natural sea arches. Enjoy a guided town stroll and take time for independent exploring here.

- Wear warm, layered clothing; include a light raincoat in case of inclement weather.
- Flat, comfortable walking shoes are recommended.

- Ride through the beautiful countryside of Normandy in a vintage motorbike with a sidecar.
- Switch between sitting in the sidecar and directly behind the driver on the motorbike.

DESCRIPTION


Take an exhilarating ride along coastal Normandy in a vintage motorbike with a sidecar and feel the wind in your hair as you take in the unobstructed views of the French countryside. A local driver will pilot the vehicle, allowing you to just sit back and relax as the motorbike follows a coastal route to several immensely picturesque seaside villages. You will pass through places such as atmospheric Villerville, which is built atop a lengthy seaside cliff, and Trouville-sur-Mer, a town with a beachfront so beautiful that it inspired French Impressionist Claude Monet and marine painter Eugene Boudin to capture its waterfront promenade in numerous works of art. You will also drive through the glamorous resort town of Deauville, where you will likely see the thoroughbred race track and a villa built in the early 20th century for Baron Henri de Rothschild. During stops, you may switch positions between the sidecar and sitting directly behind the driver on the motorbike.

D-DAY LANDING BEACHES

HIGHLIGHTS

- Enjoy a scenic two-hour drive across Normandy to the seaside village of Arromanches.
- Tour the D-Day Museum where the remains of a Mulberry Harbor can still be seen, and exhibits include working operations models and an exceptional archival film presentation.
- Visit the American Cemetery, its row after row of perfectly aligned white marble markers creating an unforgettably affecting vision.
- Stand humbled at Pointe du Hoc and Omaha Beach, where heroic and horrific events unfolded.

DESCRIPTION

Pay your respects to the brave and never forgotten on a drive through now-peaceful countryside, visiting Normandy's most significant D-Day invasion sites. In the village of Arromanches, tour a museum where remnants of an ingenious Mulberry Harbor can still be seen; these improvised floating piers and roadways allowed crucial arms and supplies to be offloaded without using existing ports heavily defended by the Germans. At Colleville Saint Laurent, walk amongst the sea of white crosses and Stars of David that mark the final resting place of nearly 9,400 soldiers who paid the ultimate sacrifice during the Normandy campaign, and see the names of 1,557 others forever-inscribed on the Wall of the Missing memorial. The site overlooks Omaha Beach, where perhaps the most terrifying landing of all took place – and some 2,000 U.S. soldiers perished, many before even reaching the sand. At Pointe du Hoc, stand before a rugged granite monument commemorating the spot where Army Rangers scaled a 100-foot cliff by rope ladder to disarm German artillery positions aimed at the Omaha Beach operation. Overall, this excursion is a pilgrimage any freedom-loving traveler will find profoundly moving.

HISTORIC ROUEN

HIGHLIGHTS

- Drive through country the Seine snakes through, to landmark-laden Rouen.
- Walk this compact medieval wonderland with your guide and encounter many of its top sights.
- See the cathedral Claude Monet obsessed over and the square where Joan of Arc met her fiery end,

DESCRIPTION

Enjoy a countryside drive to historic Rouen along the River Seine, capital of Normandy and once a powerhouse city of medieval Europe. On arrival, you'll take to the cobbled streets for an expertly guided walk through this remarkable time capsule of a town, where classic half-timbered houses and gems of Gothic architecture seem to lurk around every corner. One of the high points of the walk will be Notre-Dame, Rouen's signature cathedral. Its ornate façade was a favorite subject of Claude Monet, who painted it a series of canvasses, capturing the light at different times of day. You'll walk past ancient houses along la Rue Saint Romain, now home to inviting cafes and shops. At la Place du Vieux Marché – the old market square – you'll see where Joan of Arc burned at the stake in 1431, and a few scenic streets away, the famous 14th-century Gros Horloge astronomical clock, set into its arched tower in a fine gilded frame. On yet another small square, see another Flamboyant Gothic stunner, the towering Church of St. Maclou. Once your guided walk ends, spend a while longer wandering this wonderful city on your own before the drive back to Honfleur.

HIGHLIGHTS OF PARIS

HIGHLIGHTS

- Journey from Honfleur to Paris by panoramic coach, crossing through a scenic French landscape.

Enjoy an overview of the City of Light's most significant sights on this panoramic coach excursion from the Normandy coast to Paris. The journey from the port city on the mouth of the Seine to the romantic city that straddles its banks takes a couple hours, but the rolling countryside scenery makes time fly by. Once in Paris, your orientation drive will bring you past iconic landmarks and locales including the Eiffel Tower, a beloved emblem of the city that was actually reviled when it went up in 1889, and the Place de la Concorde, where the guillotine famously came down on Louis XIV and Marie Antoinette in 1793. Passing the Louvre – well, that will take a while; it covers a lot of ground. At midday, you'll have about 90 minutes' free time to seek the lunch of your choosing; fabulous food is never far from wherever you are in this town. Afterwards, you'll resume your city survey, passing landmarks like the magnificent Arc de Triomphe, where 12 avenues converge to form one of the busiest circles anywhere, and Notre Dame, the triumphant love letter to Gothic architecture that took 150 years to complete. Ahh, there's only one Paris.

This non-tour is the ideal solution for independent-minded travelers who wish to explore Paris at their own pace and discretion. Leaving the Honfleur pier by coach with your escort, you will be transported to the city center and dropped off near Place de la Concorde. It's a convenient rendezvous spot for fashionable Rue de Rivoli and Rue Saint Honoré shopping, a Louvre visit, or whatever else you have in mind with 4-5 hours to spend and all of Paris to sightsee. While this is a self-guided excursion, your escort will remain available at the drop-off point for a while to help answer any questions you may have about what to do with your time, or how to get it done. Then, you're on your own. At a preset time, you'll need to be back at the same location to rejoin your coach for the return drive to Honfleur pier. Plan this step wisely: those who run late for pickup must then make their own way back to the ship, at their own expense.

HELPFUL HINTS

- Wear weather-appropriate clothing; include a light sweater or jacket.
- Flat, comfortable walking shoes are recommended.
- Bring a hat, sunglasses and sunscreen as needed.

ACCESSIBLE NORMANDY D-DAY BEACHES AND WWII CEMETERY

HIGHLIGHTS

- • Gain a more complete understanding of D-Day by visiting pivotal sites in the invasion.
- • Browse the Utah Beach D-Day Museum, which chronologically recounts the invasion.
- • View the steep cliffs that American troops scaled to neutralize a German artillery battery.

DESCRIPTION

Visit some of the most significant sites in the D-Day invasion at Normandy, which marked the beginning of the Allied liberation of northwest Europe. You will first see Utah Beach where more than 20,000 troops landed on D-Day. For a more comprehensive understanding of this watershed invasion, you will browse the Utah Beach D-Day Museum. The exhibits chronologically recount the story of D-Day, from the preparation of the strategic landing to its final outcome, which altered the face of the war. Continuing on to Pointe du Hoc, you will view the cliffs overlooking the English Channel that American soldiers climbed while suffering heavy losses to disarm a German stronghold. You will also have the opportunity to visit the Normandy American Cemetery and Memorial at Omaha Beach. This is the final resting place of nearly 9,400 soldiers who died during the Normandy campaign. Traveling through the sea of marble crosses and Stars of David is a deeply moving experience.

- • Wear flat comfortable walking shoes
